

On our R. E trip we went to a Gurdwara located in Sheffield. It was a significantly large building, outside of the Gurdwara was a oringe triangle flag which was called Nishaan Sahib this means 'House of Gurn'. The Curdwara is the place of worship for Sikhim and the gurn home. Whene we first entered the building we washed our hand's and then the girlsput their shoes and coatin one room and then so do the boys, some people brought their own scarfs in but if you dight you would receive one. Then we walked to the prayer room it was a very big room. The lady talked to us about the 5'ks which was: kara this is a steel braclet which can not be removed it shows that Sikhs should not do anything that the gurn would not approve of this is why the braclet is always worn on the right hand and it is steel because it is a symbol of unbreakable attachment and commitment, the karga which is a wooden comb, kaccha this is cotton andwear, kirpan a stell sword and kesh this means uncut hair this is because the hair is God's gift and it helps take pride in ones apperance. She showed us a photo of the golden temple this is one of the greatest attractions because it is a spiritual hab it is located in Amristar, the hotest temple in Sikh faith, the golden temple is so holy because it embodies the core principles of Sikhism, such as equality, humility, and community service. After we heard the priest read from the gurn Granth sahib then we was given some food and atein the langar.
